



Africa Source II - Feedback Forms Analysis


We have received 100 feedback forms filled out by the participants. Below is an outline of their answers; an example form is attached.


1. Quality of Daily Schedule


The participants were asked (Q.1) to grade the quality of the daily schedule and the facilities and food. Please see the charts below representing their answers.



































2. Perception

Overall, the participants found the program intense, educative, informative and inspiring. When asked (Q.2) to describe their Africa Source II experience they were challenged, enlightned, enriched and supported. Many felt that Africa Source II was an eye-opener. It enabled them to built a network with passionate fellow participants and they felt engaged. Some even felt humbled. Other terms used were amongst others 'amazing, awesome, boosted, brilliant, broadening, excellent, exhilerating, fantastic, free, grateful, infopacked, motivated, resourceful, revolutionary, wonderful'.

3. Expectations

64% found that the week-long workshop exceeded their expectations. 32% thought that their expectations were met and it fell short for 2%, in both cases because they had expected more developers to participate and more technically advanced workshops. The remaining 2% did not answer the question (Q.3).

The participants enjoyed the pace of the event (Q.4). The days were very full and some found it tiring, though they did enjoy the time to interact in between sessions, especially during the time off in the afternoons.

4. Relevancy

With almost no exception, the participants found the sessions very relevant to their work and/or to their own development and future work in the NGO sector (Q.5). They made many


new connections and were able to expand their network (Q.6). Many new projects were conceived, please see the Outcomes section of this report.


5. Location


Most people did like the location and venue: beautiful and spectacular. However some mentioned the lack of hot water, the heavy stroms during the nights while sleeping in tents, the limited internet connectivity and power breakdowns. The venue was very remote (Q.7).


6. Quality of Evening Program and Information

The participants were also asked (Q.8) to grade the evening program, pre-event information, the event website and the event wiki. The charts below represent their answers.









7. Possible Changes

To make a next Source event better (Q.9) participants suggested to expand the amount of sessions, to duplicate sessions, to expand the time given to the sessions, and to make the duration of the camp longer in order to fit it all in. Many people had the feeling that they could not attend all sessions they were interested in and supported the idea to not have parallel runnings of simular topics. Some also wanted to have more in-depth discussions on the (short) skill shares with more intensive insight/hands-on sessions.

They also suggested to improve the facilities, food variety, and the unstable internet and power situation.

8. Quality of Specific Sessions

Of the sessions most valuable (Q.10), participants wrote down a variety of those that they attended. The sessions on Alternative Access, Asterix, Civic CRM, Creative Commons, Localisation, Migration, Security, Thin Client, and Wireless were pointed out more often, but as said in fact all sessions were mentioned. Only a few people named sessions that were least valuable (Q.11), again varying too much in order to draw a conclusion.
